### I. Introduction.

# II. David submits to the LORD's chastisement. v. 14-23

- A. The LORD determined that David's infant son must die. v. 14-15a
  - 1. What was David's most serious sin? Not adultery, nor murder, but that he had brought dishonor to the LORD's name. v. 14a Ps. 8:174:18
  - 2. There should be no greater deterrent to our sin than how our actions will affect the LORD's reputation. Mt. 6:9
  - 3. Why was it necessary that the LORD deal so severely with David's sin? v. 14b
  - 4. Though God has forgiven us, He may force us to reap sin's consequences. Ga. 6:7f
  - 5. Church discipline reflects how seriously the LORD takes sin. I Co. 5 Mt. 18:15ff
  - 6. Why does the LORD punish the son for the sins of his father?
- B. David pleads with the LORD for the life of his infant son. v. 15b-17
  - 1. The LORD's judgment is carried out quickly. v. 15b
  - 2. David earnestly seeks mercy from God prayer and fasting. v. 16-17 Mark 9:29
  - 3. If LORD has already pronounced judgment, then why does David bother to pray? v. 22 Jonah 3:9 Joel 2:13-14 Jer. 18:7-8 26:3 Nu. 14:11ff
  - 4. Plead with the LORD while there is hope. Lu. 18:1ff Mt. 7:7ff 15:22ff Js. 4:2
- C. David submits to the LORD's will in the death of his child. v. 18-23a
  - 1. The LORD's answer is "no" David's son dies. v. 18a
  - 2. Did God say 'no' because David didn't have enough faith? I Jo. 5:14 Mt. 26:39
  - 3. David's servants fear that David might do himself harm (suicide?). v 18b
  - 4. David worships the LORD. v. 19-20 Job 1:20-21
  - 5. How do you react when God says "no"? <u>Job 1:20-21</u> <u>13:15</u>
  - 6. When you are deeply hurt or disappointed submit to the LORD and worship Him.
- D. David expects to go to his dead son one day. v. 23b
  - 1. Why do some babies die young? Why are some born with handicaps? John 9:2ff
  - 2. What happens to the souls of infants dying in infancy? Deut. 29:29
  - 3. In what sense does David expect to go to his son?
    - a. Some say that David simply expects to join him in the grave. Acts 2:29
    - b. Because the context suggests that David is expressing the hope and comfort God gives, it makes more sense to think that he expected to see his son in heaven.
    - c. Where is David now? Ps. 23:6 17:15 16:9-11 Heb. 11:32,16
  - 4. What other reasons do we have to hope that infants dying in infancy go to heaven?
    - a. John the Baptist was filled with the Spirit in his mother's womb. Lu. 1:15,44
    - b. Jeremiah was set apart to God in the womb. Jer. 1:4-5
    - c. Those who are judged are condemned based upon their wicked deeds which an infant has not yet done. Re. 20:11ff Mt. 25:31ff Eze. 18:20 Co. 3:6 Jo. 8:21ff
    - d. The LORD's nature is merciful and just. Ex. 34:6-7 Gen. 18:25
    - e. Other texts which some use to infer the salvation of infants who die: Ps. 8:2 22:10 139:15ff Mt. 19:14 Mark 10:13-14 Ezek. 16:20-22 Job 3:11-19 Ecc. 6:3-6 I Ki. 14:13 Jonah 4:11 Jer. 19:4 2:34
  - 5. How can infants be saved?
    - a. Is there an age of accountability? Dt. 1:39 Isa. 7:15 Jonah 4:11
    - b. Infants are affected by the guilt and pollution of Adam's sin from conception. Ps. 51:4 58:3 Is. 48:8 Ro. 5:12ff
    - c. The LORD is able to regenerate and redeem them. John 3:3 I Tim. 2:5

## III. David receives the LORD's kindness and mercy. v. 24-31

- A. The LORD blesses David and Bathsheba with another (beloved) son. v. 24-25
  - 1. David comforts his wife. v. 24a II Co. 1:3-4
  - 2. A marriage begun sinfully is still a marriage in which both partners should seek, with God's help, to fulfill their duties to one another. Deut. 24:1-4 Eph. 5:22ff
  - 3. The LORD gives David and Bathsheba a son in the place of the son who died. v. 24b Gen. 4:25
  - 4. The LORD often shows special kindness to hurting mourning sinners. Mt. 5:4
  - 5. The son is named Solomon, which speaks of the peace God gives. v. 24c I Chr. 22:9
  - 6. Solomon is beloved by the LORD and is also given the name Jedidiah. v. 25
  - 7. Solomon is chosen by the LORD to be David's successor in fulfillment of the covenant. 7:12ff I Ki. 1:11ff Mt. 1:6 Neh. 13:26
  - 8. Why would the LORD love Solomon -- a son who is the product of a marriage which began with adultery and murder? Sovereign electing grace! Deut. 7:7-8
  - 9. We are beloved sons (and daughters) on the same basis as Solomon (Jedidiah) God's sovereign electing grace. Eph. 1:3ff Titus 3:5
  - 10. David and Bathsheba also have another son whom they name Nathan, who is in the line of Christ through Mary. I Chron. 3:5 14:4 Luke 3:31
- B. The LORD gives David victory over the Ammonites. v. 26-31 Ps. 3:7 18:37 68:1
  - 1. Our story has finally come full circle. 10:1-11:1
  - 2. David finally does what he should have done to begin with. v. 26-29 Jo. 8:11
  - 3. When we repent we should look for opportunities to make right what we have done wrong. II Co. 7:11 Titus 2:14
  - 4. David is exalted in victory. v. 30
  - 5. Why is David exalted while the Ammonites are crushed?
  - 6. What happens to the Ammonites? v. 31 10:4 Judges 10:7ff Ps. 2

### IV. Concluding applications.

- A. The LORD restores David. Ps. 51:12
- B. How does this passage point us to Christ?
  - 1. Jesus is the beloved Son in whom the promises of the covenant are fulfilled. John 3:16 Mt. 3:17 Mark 9:7 Isa. 40:1
  - 2. As David's son died in his place, Jesus, the beloved Son of David, died in our place. I Pe. 3:18 II Co. 5:21
  - 3. The gross sin which seemed to threaten the promise leads to the fulfillment of the promise. Acts 2:23
  - 4. As David won a great victory over the LORD's enemies and was crowned, so Christ has defeated sin, Satan and death and is crowned LORD of all. He. 2:9 Jo. 19:2ff
  - 5. We share in His victory and His exaltation. Rev. 2:10 I Pe. 5:4

- 10. In what ways does this passage point to Christ?
